Preservation Trust Fund Get Outdoors Fund Board of Trustees Meeting, 06.01.2023

Conservation Grant Program Overview

The response to the announcement of the second round of the FY23 Preservation Trust Fund (PTF) and Get Outdoors (GO) Fund grant round was quite robust. Both programs received proposals from a wide variety of applicants with a diverse suite of proposals from across the Commonwealth. Funding was made available at the following amounts: \$1,800,000 for PTF and \$200,000 for the GO Fund. In total, VOF received 26 PTF applications, for a total of just under \$6,900,000 in requested PTF funds, and 65 GO preapplications for a total request of \$1,300,000 in GO funds, 29 of which were invited to submit final applications.

Preservation Trust Fund

The Preservation Trust Fund was fully funded in FY23, with \$4 million available for the program.

PTF-Easement Assistance Report & Recommendations

\$300,000 was set aside for PTF-Easement Assistance (PTF-EA) Program, which has traditionally been used to assist income-eligible landowners with the costs associated with recording an easement, such as surveys, legal and appraisal services, etc. To date, \$172,500 has been allocated to a total of 15 easement projects. A summary chart of the PTF-Easement Assistance is included for review. Awards of \$20,000 or less have been administratively awarded by designated VOF staff (delegated by VOF Board of Trustees on 03.30.2017) while awards above \$20,000 require Board action.

PTF Program Report & Recommendations

Due to project cancellations and excess easement assistance funds, there is \$2,052,640 available to allocate for projects in the Spring FY23 PTF grant round. Staff is recommending 10 proposals, with total funding of \$2,052,640. The recommended projects are listed in the following chart along with executive summaries of all applications. All submitted applications are in the board meeting materials online.

Get Outdoors (GO) Fund

GO Fund Program Report & Recommendations

Due to reduced funding available and the overwhelming response in past grant rounds, a new preapplication requirement was incorporated in the GO Fund process in FY23. This short preapplication process helped better manage both VOF staff and applicant time investment/workload as well as applicant expectations for success. The preapplication contains basic questions about the general nature of a proposal, and responses were evaluated by staff using program review criteria. Those preapplications that most closely aligned with the goals of the GO Fund were invited to submit final applications. In this grant round, 29 of 65 preapplications were invited to submit final proposals, ensuring around a 50% chance of receiving a grant award. Staff recommended projects for the GO Fund are summarized in the following chart along with executive summaries of all applications. Details about each recommended project, as well as copies of all applications submitted, are available in the board meeting materials online. Copies of pre-applications are available upon request. Thanks to work by the Finance Committee, there is \$222,500 available to allocate for projects. Staff is recommending funding for 12 proposals for a total of \$222,500 in GO funds.

Project Title: Downhill and Skills Mountain Bike Area at Biscuit Run Park

Locality: Albemarle County

Funds Requested: \$25,000.00

Description: Expedite the Biscuit Run Park (BRP) Mountain Bike Area project by obtaining engineering phase funding, in order to achieve shovel-ready status and enable the Charlottesville Area Mountain Bike Club (CAMBC) to fund project construction in 2023 (prior to BRP opening for public use). Accelerating this project will enable concurrency with the construction of the BRP entrance and trailhead project - thereby maximizing efficiencies, minimizing environmental impacts, and reducing trail closures.

Applicant: 4, Boys & Girls Clubs of Southwest Virginia **Project Title:** BGCSWVA Bike Program

Locality: Roanoke, City of

Funds Requested: \$23,400.00

Description: Club Members at our 9th Street Club serving Roanoke City Public Schools are invited to join Star City Cycling Club to take advantage of new outdoor mountain biking trails at nearby Morningside Park. If awarded, the grant would pay for 20 to 30 mountain bikes for kids ages 6 to 18, plus a place to store them. That would enable the program to get 40 to 60 individuals participating every year (both Club kids and other kids in our Southeast Roanoke neighborhood).

Participants will also attend an information session to learn about local trails, camping areas, and how to use gear.

Project Title: Lights On!

Locality: Greene County

Funds Requested: \$25,000.00

Description: The Greene County Community Park has developed slowly across the past 23 years from an empty field with no access to a park with walking trails, several soccer fields, a paved entry way, a ga ga pit, and picnic tables. However, there is much to be done to the County's only local recreational area, including the addition of lighting in the parking area. Electricity was not always readily available within the park, but now that it is, the need for safety lighting is a priority for the community.

Applicant: 9, Goochland County Parks & Recreation Project Title: Tucker Park Kayak Access Locality: Goochland County Funds Reguested: \$16,000.00

Description: Tucker Park at Maidens Crossing has a primitive launch. Previously, LL Bean hosted an outdoor discovery school providing kayaks and stand-up paddle boards at the park for users. Since they disbanded the school, there has been no option for users to rent kayaks at the park. Consistent access to kayaks has always been in demand at the park location. This project allows for install and start-up of a revenue-share kayak service near the boat launch.

Project Title: Rapidan River Water Trail: Expanding Public River Access in Orange County, VA **Locality:** Orange County

Funds Requested: \$25,000.00

Description: The Historic Germanna Foundation is working with Friends of the Rappahannock and local partners to develop a new canoe and kayak launch to the Rapidan River at our visitor center property in Locust Grove, Virginia. Once complete, this will be the furthest west access point on the Rapidan River water trail, adding 7.75 miles of recreational opportunity open to the public for paddling, fishing, wildlife viewing, and more.

Applicant: 13, James River Association

Project Title: Virginia Capital Trail Realignment

Locality: Richmond, City of

Funds Requested: \$25,000.00

Description: The James River Association (JRA), with project partners, will realign a segment of the Virginia Capital Trail along Dock St. in Richmond to improve user safety and experience. This segment, unlike other parts of the Cap Trail, sits directly on the street and is separated from car traffic by only a temporary barrier. Plans are to relocate this segment by joining the trail at Great Shiplock Park, through properties owned by The Conservation Fund and JRA (for its future James A. Buzzard Education Center).

Applicant: 15, Lewis and Clark Exploratory Center of Virginia

Project Title: Watershed Digital Mapping and Filmmaking Workshops

Locality: Albemarle County

Funds Requested: \$15,000.00

Description: Our Watershed Digital Mapping and Filmmaking Workshops invite children and adults to participate in a community mapping project of the Rivanna River watershed. The project is focused on the stream and river access of the Lewis & Clark Exploratory Center, but also covers areas outside of our park location. We teach participants how to make digital maps and how to film above and below water. The digital maps are multi-media and are comprised of the map itself, video, photography, and field notes.

Applicant: 16, Lick Run Community Development Corporation Project Title: Take Root - Young Adult Urban Agriculture Training Locality: Roanoke, City of

Funds Requested: \$25,000.00

Description: The Take Root program, through a coalition of nonprofits and urban agriculture experts, provides high-school students with a paid work-learn experience on a three-acre urban farm and other community sites, building community food security. The program teaches best practices for urban agriculture, provides workforce readiness and coaching, gives participants hands-on experience with producing and preparing healthy food, and helps these young adults develop as leaders in their community.

Project Title: Piedmont Arts Pollinator Path

Locality: Martinsville, City of

Funds Requested: \$25,000.00

Description: This project is for the creation of a community-based pollinator garden and trail. Piedmont Arts, a non-profit arts museum, owns a large swath of unused land between the museum and a museum owned art garden. We are creating an ADA complaint pathway that will be flanked by native and non-invasive plant species to nourish pollinators. There will also be raised beds for adoption by the community. The garden will create opportunities for community gathering, beautification, and land stewardship.

Funds Requested: \$25,000.00

Description: To engage Richmond area schools and other groups. Maintain burial plots, provide educational tours, free online books and video interviews at historic Black cemeteries. Document the stories of guest hosts and descendants. 4 to 20 Students/Volunteers (possibly more) start a 20-minute walk, talk & listen tour followed by 2-hour land clean up. Funds Requested: \$15,000.00

Description: This program aims to eliminate obstacles to meaningful outdoor experiences in Shenandoah National Park. Every year, the Park reaches thousands of students with age and gradeappropriate programs designed to educate and inspire future enjoyment and stewardship of the natural world. Support for the program is leveraged towards coverage of all gear, equipment, presentation, and transportation costs to ensure open access for all. Description: The Town of Mount Jackson owns a 0.7-acre lot between King Street & the Shenandoah Valley Rail-Trail. The lot was previously used as a gas station, refuse station, and currently sits vacant. Development of the site into a public park will help to achieve the following benefits: provide a permanent space for festival vendors, a farmers' market, expansion of downtown parking options without adding a parking lot and provide an attractive gateway into the Town's proposed Rail-Trail for biking & walking.

Description: This project will add primitive campsites, signage and a picnic shelter on 3 acres owned by the Town of Pound along the, currently being developed, Pine Mountain C&O Trail. It will be ADA accessible and used as an outdoor classroom as well.

Project Title: Trinity Family Life Center, Trinity Village Gardens

Funds Requested: \$25,000.00

Description: Trinity Village Garden is an urban garden project on the grounds of Trinity Family Life Center. We currently have 21 garden boxes, 15 fruit trees planted and a 21x 40-foot greenhouse. Our plan includes an expansion of the garden and a safe green space area for public use and for outdoor enjoyment and entertainment. We plan to expand our stone walking trail to encompass the adjacent area, erect a fence mural, plant wildflowers and begin building an outdoor stage in the encompassed area.

Project Title: Loose Parts Play/Ground

Locality: Richmond, City of

Funds Requested: \$10,114.03

Description: We are developing a new experimental form of Loose Parts adventure playground and a series of short-term play actions for Richmond, Virginia. The model of the historic adventure playground has four essential components: a vacant lot, salvaged building materials, kids, and an adult/teen playworker. In these new playspaces, this approach will be overlaid with an experimental, ancillary relationship between children and the work of contemporary artists.
