Brief Summary*:

An outdoor development initiative at Big Cherry Lake is underway to create a day and overnight destination that will enhance the High Knob area experience. The Town of Big Stone Gap owns the 250-acre lake; with support from the federal, state the Town has secured funds to create walking trails around the lake and develop 18 campsites at Big Cherry Lake The next phase, and the purpose of this funding request to VOF, is to install a concrete boat ramp, courtesy pier, dock and ADA fishing pier.

Project Description

Project Description*:

Friends of Southwest Virginia, a regional non profit is applying on behalf of Big Stone Gap Va for this funding opportunity, in order to expand capacity and regional support. The property at Big Cherry Reservoir is on 250 acres and owned by the Town of Big Stone Gap, and located in Wise County, Virginia. Big Cherry Lake rests amid a magnificent mountain basin, with elevations above sea level varying from 3000 feet downstream of Big Cherry Dam to 4223 feet at its head on High Knob. Big Cherry Lake is 8.5 miles west of Big Stone Gap's thriving downtown, a Virginia Main Street Affiliate Community. The Town hosts over 100 annual events each year and serves as the entertainment hub for Wise County. Currently, the area of the boat launch site at Big Cherry Lake is a gravel base that erodes easily and can scratch boats if paddlers do not land properly. Additionally, the lake does not have access to ADA supported fishing along the shore of the lake. Improving the boat ramp, installing a courtesy pier and dock for boat use, and developing an ADA-compliant fishing pier with accessible admission adjacent to the ramp will significantly enhance Big Cherry Lake's recreational opportunities in various ways. Friends of Southwest Virginia believes the proposed improvements will greatly enhance Big Cherry Lake's recreational opportunities in various ways. The addition of a fishing pier will allow increased fishing access for bank fishermen and boaters alike. The fishing pier will also allow ADA-compliant fishing access to individuals with decreased mobility. Additionally, the improvements listed in this project will enable the DWR easier access to the lake, giving them better opportunities to monitor and enhance the fisheries and recreation opportunities.

Land Protection*:

The Town of Big Stone Gap owns the land for this project, through this opportunity the town council has elected to restrict developments to the lake in the interest of providing a pristine recreation experience, in perpetuity. This will be done by establishing a recreational easement to protects the land from development.

Goals and Objectives*:

Goal #1: Increase outdoor recreation amenities at Big Cherry Lake. Objective #1: Install a concrete boat ramp and courtesy pier and dock for boat use to increase boating and water recreation on Big Cherry Lake. Objective #2: Install a 60-foot ADA-compliant fishing pier to increase fishing access for bank fishermen. Objective #3: Improvements will also allow the DWR easier access to the lake, giving them better opportunities to monitor and enhance the fisheries and recreation opportunities. Goal #2: Increase visitation to Big Cherry Lake to 3,000 new visitors and generate \$90,000 in additional local revenue by June 30, 2025. Objective #1: The concrete boat ramp, courtesy pier, and fishing pier will provide more access to visitors to enjoy Big Cherry Lake. Objective #2: Allow ADA-compliant fishing access to individuals with decreased mobility. Objective #3: The boat ramp and fishing pier improvements, along with the installation of the campsites and improved trails, will give visitors increased opportunities for hiking, backpacking, boating, fishing, and general outdoor recreation.

Part of a Larger Movement*:

Yes, this project is part of a larger movement, which includes the High Knob Recreational Initiative, which connects the Big Cherry Lake to Scott County's Devil's Bathtub, Scott County Park campsites, Flag Rock Recreation Area, High Knob Observation Tower, High Knob Recreation Area, and the vast area of the Jefferson National Forest. Additionally, the full scope of the Recreational Initiative is to expand and connect the Town of Appalachia with the Town of Big Stone Gap and its existing trail networks, notably the Powell River Trail. It's also important to note that the Big Cherry Lake has been referenced in the Virginia Outdoor Plan and the High Knob Recreational Initiative as "priority projects."

How will this area be managed in the future?

Future Management*:

The Town of Big Stone Gap will manage the Big Cherry Reservoir property as part of their Parks and Recreation Department. Relatively speaking, the impact of the improvements to the area will be minimal, with the boat launch and pier being sustainable infrastructure with minimal upkeep for

the next 15 years.

The High Knob Region will benefit from this project from both quality of life and economic development components. The High Knob Region consists of the Lenowisco Planning District and includes Scott, Wise, and Lee Counties and the City of Norton. Regionally tourism in this region exceeds \$87 million in spending, with over \$2 million generated in local tax receipts. Each community works to meet the business and activity needs of its local population, but the High Knob Region as a whole is working to showcase its offerings collectively and connect to the visitor market. The Big Cherry Lake project will complement the existing water-based recreation assets and create an all-inclusive experience that will create greater accessibility for visitors to gain confidence in the outdoors and the High Knob Mountain range. The improvements to Big Cherry Lake will expand the client base for outdoor recreation businesses and uniquely enhance the High Knob experience.

Describe how the community has been involved in the development of this proposal and/or will be involved in the implementation of this project. Describe how community support is shown for this project.

Community Involvement*:

The Town of Big Stone Gap and the entire LENOWISCO region have been actively involved with the planning of this project for several years. The Town of Big Stone Gap will be involved with overseeing the building and construction of the boat ramp, courtesy pier and dock for boat use, and an ADA-compliant fishing pier with accessible access. Community support is also high for this project. In 2019, when the High Knob Recreational Initiative and High Knob Master Plan were published, Friends of Southwest Virginia interviewed 124 local individuals who were engaged in developing the High Knox area. During the facilitated working session, participants identified Big Cherry Lake as one top three projects the region should pursue. Since then, Big Stone Gap has worked closely with local and regional partners to expand access, evaluate the opportunity, and break down barriers to entry to a fantastic experience. Additionally, the Town of Big Town Gap has taken steps to ensure safety measures at Big Cherry Lake. One key step includes installing solar powered cameras in key areas. Additionally, the Town is looking to provide wi-fi access during future development buildout. Finally, local law enforcement will have this amenity on their patrol route.

Lake will have a positive economic impact on the entire High Knob region. Friends of Southwest Virginia is seeking \$150,000 for enhancements to the Big Cherry Lake, including installing a concrete boat ramp and courtesy pier and dock for boat use and an ADA-compliant fishing pier with accessible access adjacent to the ramp. Total cost of the project: \$834,000 Other funding sources for Big Cherry Lake projects include: Virginia Energy \$115,000; Tobacco Commission - \$300,000; DCR- Rec Trails- \$99,417.60; Please reference budget table for details

Grant Funding*:

Grant funding is a crucial component of getting this project completed. The development of the boat ramp, courtesy pier, and ADA-compliant fishing pier have been a dream deferred for a long time. The land is owned by the Town of Big Stone Gap, and the Town is currently overseeing improvements to the parking areas, adding camping amenities, and building a general store with funds from the Tobacco Commission, Virginia Energy?s AMLER funds.





I am writing this letter to express our full support for the Virginia Outdoor Foundation funding request that would install a concrete boat ramp and courtesy pier for boat use, and to install a fishing pier at Big Cherry Lake. The City of Norton believes that these projects align with the recent High Knob Master Plan, undertaken by High Knob Regional Initiative, which included the City along with Wise & Scott Counties and the Town of Big Stone Gap.

This initiative developed the High Knob Master Plan, a strategic plan offering recommendations for driving sustainable economic growth centered on outdoor recreation in the High Knob Region, which includes Wise, Scott, and Lee counties and the City of Norton.

Released in 2019, the High Knob Master Plan resulted from a four-year planning effort, partially funded by the Appalachian Regional Commission, that involved 22 partners, including communities, nonprofits, recreation user groups, state, federal, and local governmental agencies, and higher education institutions.

The High Knob Master Plan identifies as a signature project establishing a High Knob Destination Center to serve as a gateway to the High Knob Region, offering information about the region's outdoor and cultural offerings and natural history. The destination center will be in Norton and is projected to open in Fall 2023. This center will also help

better connect the region's communities and recreational assets by providing information and directing visitors to the region's variety of outdoor recreation sites and experiences.

Efforts in the High Knob Region to grow outdoor recreation tourism also have economic benefits, as cited in research from Headwaters Economics that shows "counties with outdoor recreation economies are more likely to attract new residents with greater wealth and have faster-growing wages than their non-recreation counterparts." A separate study conducted by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, "Federal Outdoor Recreation Trends: Effects on Economic Opportunities (2014)," also notes how "outdoor recreation is an important driver of economic activity in rural communities." The report states that benefits from federal recreation resources include "business activity generated from spending by recreation visitors, increased property values, and business attraction because of natural amenities those resources provide, and health benefits from physical activity and stress reduction." Both the City of Norton's Flag Rock Recreation Area and Big Stone Gap's Big Cherry Reservoir adjoin the Jefferson National Forest on the U.S. Forest Service's Clinch Ranger District.

We appreciate your consideration and please accept this letter as an indication of the City of Norton's support for Friends of Southwest Virginia's application.








LADDER FRAMING & CONCRETE RAMP


