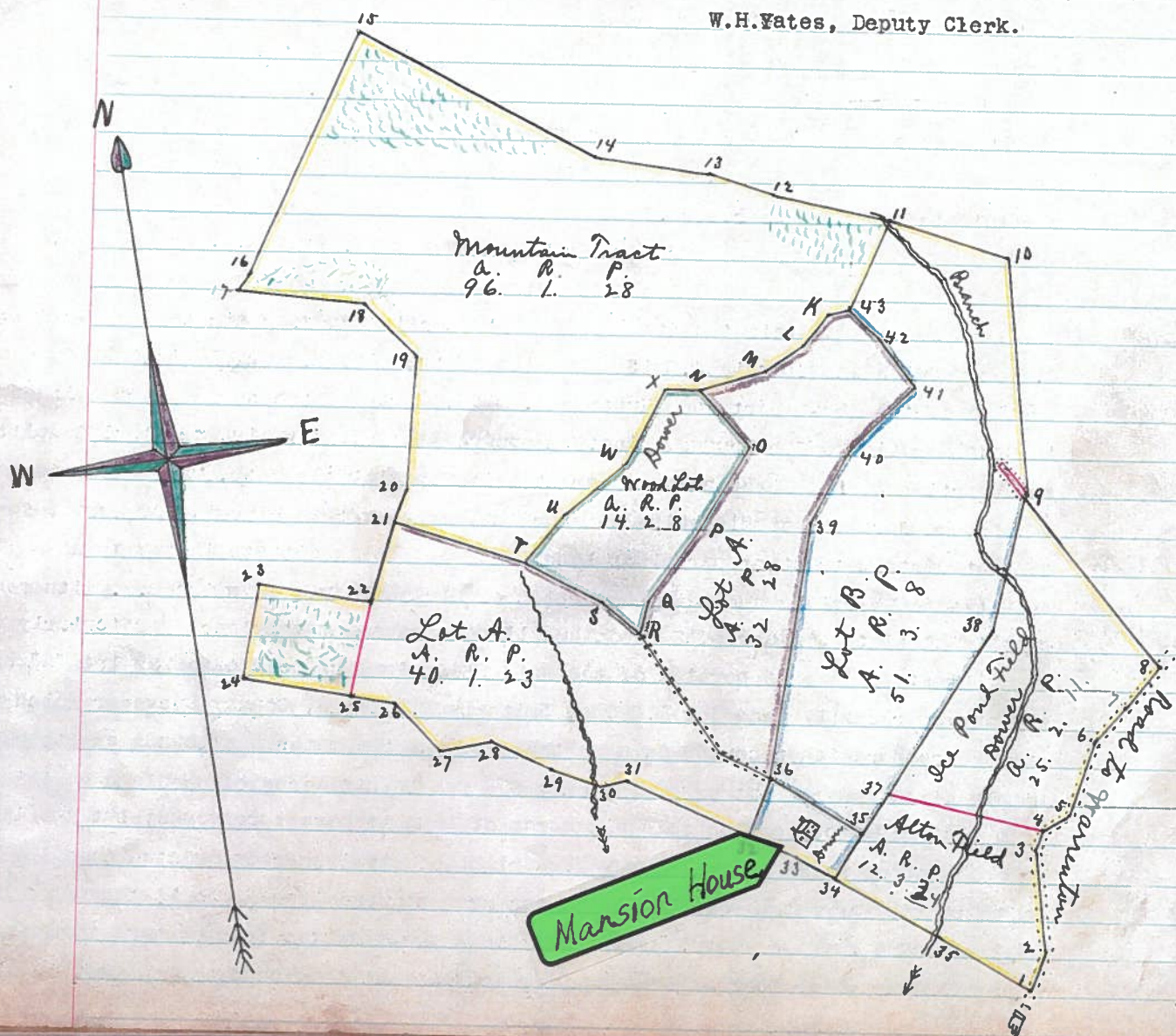

West View (Chestnut Hill) (030-0528), Marshall, ca. 1840. Located on Trapp Branch of Broad Run, West View (Chestnut Hill) was built ca. 1840 by Henry Smith. He acquired the land on which West View was built on his twenty-first birthday from his parents, Colonel William Rowley Smith and Lucy Steptoe Blackwell Smith of Alton. The oldest part of the house is the hall-parlor frame section raised upon a high stone basement. In 1846 the house was enlarged by the addition of a room as well as the wraparound porch. In 1860 a small office was added off the 1846 addition. The present kitchen wing was not built until 1952. Also located on the property are a nineteenth-century schoolhouse, a log dairy, and a log servant/slave quarters.

Alton (030-0526), Marshall, ca. 1850. Although primarily a product of the mid-nineteenth century, the large two-and-a-half-story house at Alton is actually the result of two building phases. The original section is a one-and-a-half-story log structure erected ca. 1807 by William Rowley Smith (1781-1857), who grew up at Mount Eccentric and married Lucy Steptoe Blackwell. William Smith commanded a company of cavalry in the War of 1812 and served as a colonel in the Fauquier militia in 1815. He was also a member of the state legislature for three terms. Around 1850 a two-story center-hall-plan house was added to the original log structure, giving the house its mid-nineteenth-century appearance. The property also contains a slave cabin, a meat house, and an imposing bank barn that is now separated from the house and its outbuildings by a road.

1870 CENSUS NEXT DOOR TO ISAAC SMITH

Chelsea (030-0177), Marshall, ca. 1815. Located near Bethel, Chelsea was built on land purchased by Colonel William Rowland Smith in 1815. Originally a hall-parlor-plan house, Chelsea was extended in the later nineteenth century to become a central-passage-plan house with stone and brick end chimneys. William Smith, the son of the original owner, lived here from 1836 until 1886 and operated a sawmill, gristmill, and blacksmith shop on the farm.

Enoch Smith died on July 25, 1803 in Fauquier County. His will conveyed the tract of land where he lived and six slaves to wife, Elizabeth, "during her widowhood" and then the estate was to be divided among his children. Widow Elizabeth Smith married widower Francis Triplett of Loudoun County in 1812. Records have not been found the conveyance of the property from the Smith family to another party. However, by 1815, Alexander Henderson had assembled 1,250 acres east of Pignut Mountain including the portion of the Smith property containing the 5.11-acre subject property.

◆ Alexander Henderson ◆

The parent tract of the 5.11-acre subject property was owned in succession by Alexander Henderson and his sons, Thomas & Richard Henderson. Then Richard purchased 100% of 1,000 acres formerly owned by his father. Upon Richard's death in 1841 his wife, Orra Moore Henderson, became the executrix of Richard's estate. The Henderson owners are described on pages 79 - 85. In 1847 Orra sold 270 acres to William Smith for \$5,609 (\$21 per acre). The Henderson family had owned the parent tract of the 5.11-acre subject property for more than 32 years.

◆ William Smith ◆

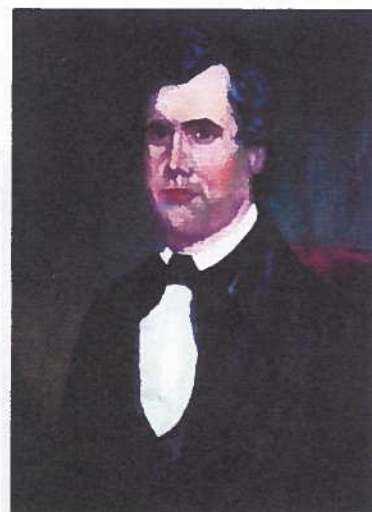
William Smith was born on April 12, 1812, in Fauquier County to Colonel William Rowley Smith (1781-1857) and his wife, Lucy Steptoe Blackwell Smith (1793-1879). When Colonel Smith purchased 314 acres in Fauquier County in 1833, the place was called Chestnut Hill, a name derived from magnificent chestnut trees near the residence. Colonel Smith changed the name of the estate to West View because of the lovely view to the west. The younger William Smith grew up on the West View Estate.

William Rowley Smith was a highly respected resident of Fauquier County. He was born on his parents' Alton Farms in Fauquier County, and served as a Justice of the Peace in Fauquier County from 1810 to 1852. William commanded a Company of Cavalry in the War of 1812 and was a Colonel in the Militia. He served as a member of the Virginia State Legislature three times. William Rowley Smith's tombstone is inscribed: "He was loved for his virtues and respected for his capacity, but shrunk from no duty. He served his country in the camp, his state in her councils, his county as a leading justice, to his people he was counsel." Colonel and Lucy Smith had 16 known children together whom they raised and educated.

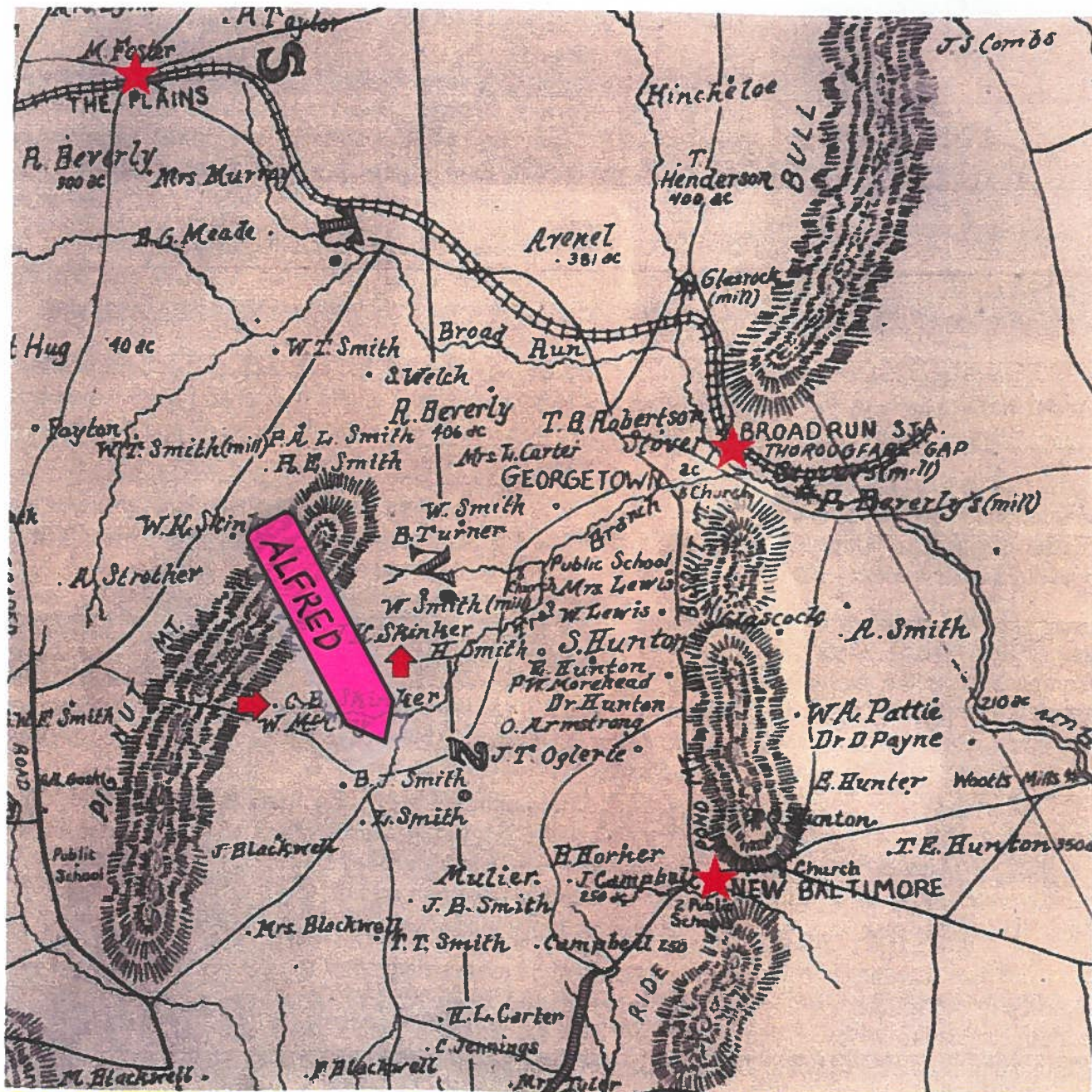


William Smith (24) married Mary Glascock on April 25, 1836 in Rectortown, Fauquier County. Their wedding was three days before Mary's 17th birthday. Mary is the daughter of farmer Aquilla Swan Glascock (1786-1867) and his wife, Susanna Lake Glascock (1790-1835). Mary was raised at Rockburn built by her father in 1828 near Rectortown in Fauquier County. After Col. John S. Mosby was severely wounded in December, 1864, at Lakeland near Atoka, a young black boy transported him in an ox cart pulled by calves to Rockburn. Aquilla Glascock was a strong Confederate supporter, and his Rockburn home was a favorite safehouse for Mosby Rangers. Aquilla welcomed Mosby Rangers day or night.



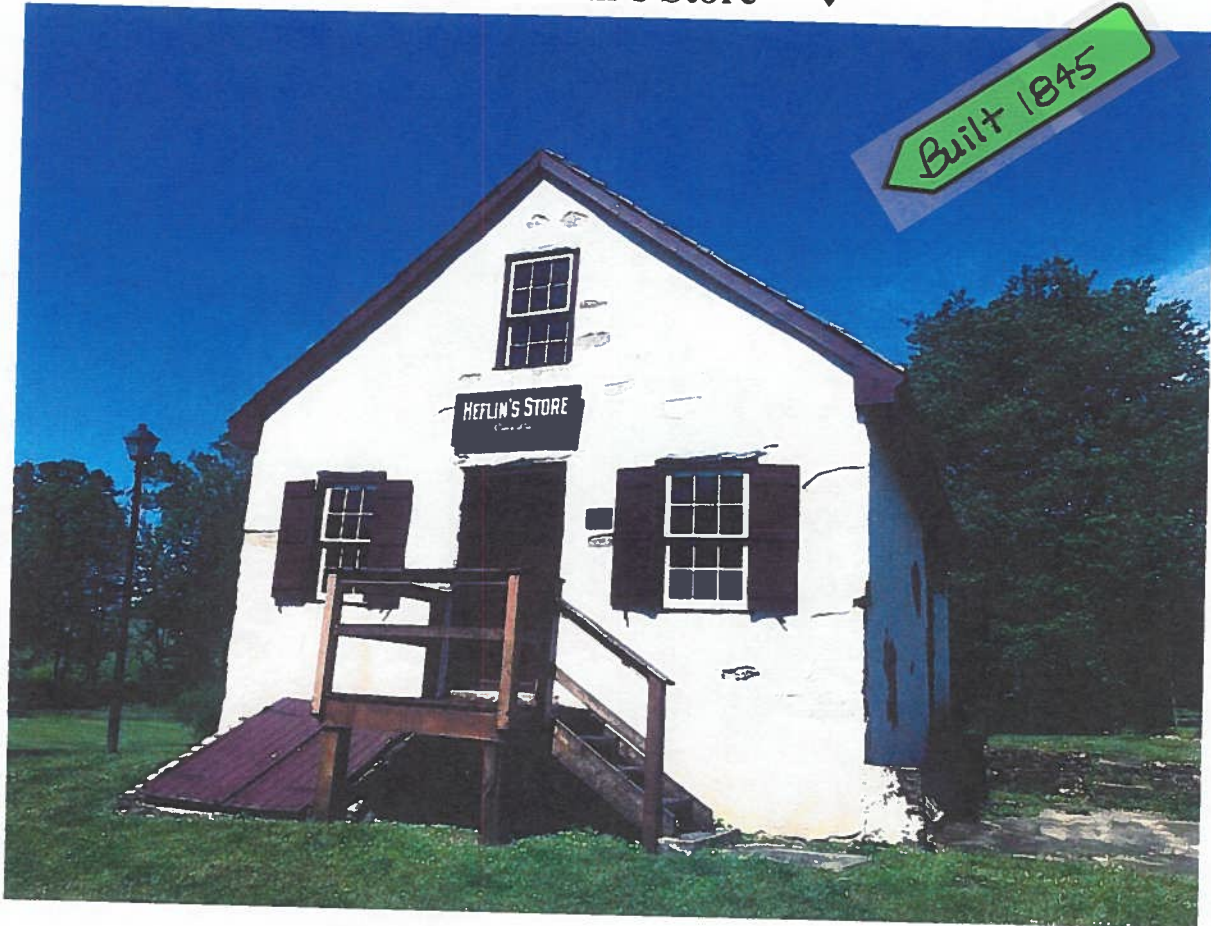
William & Mary Smith

The 1870 United State Federal Census reveals that James and Elizabeth Skinker were farming their Huntley property. Their household included four unmarried children, married daughter, Margaret McIlhany and her four children, and eleven former slaves who were employed as farm workers and domestic help. The former slaves ranged in age from 5 to 90. The value of James' real estate had declined to from \$93,680 in 1860 to \$65,000, and his personal estate declined from \$76,040 in 1850 to \$7,200 due primarily from the emancipation of his slaves.

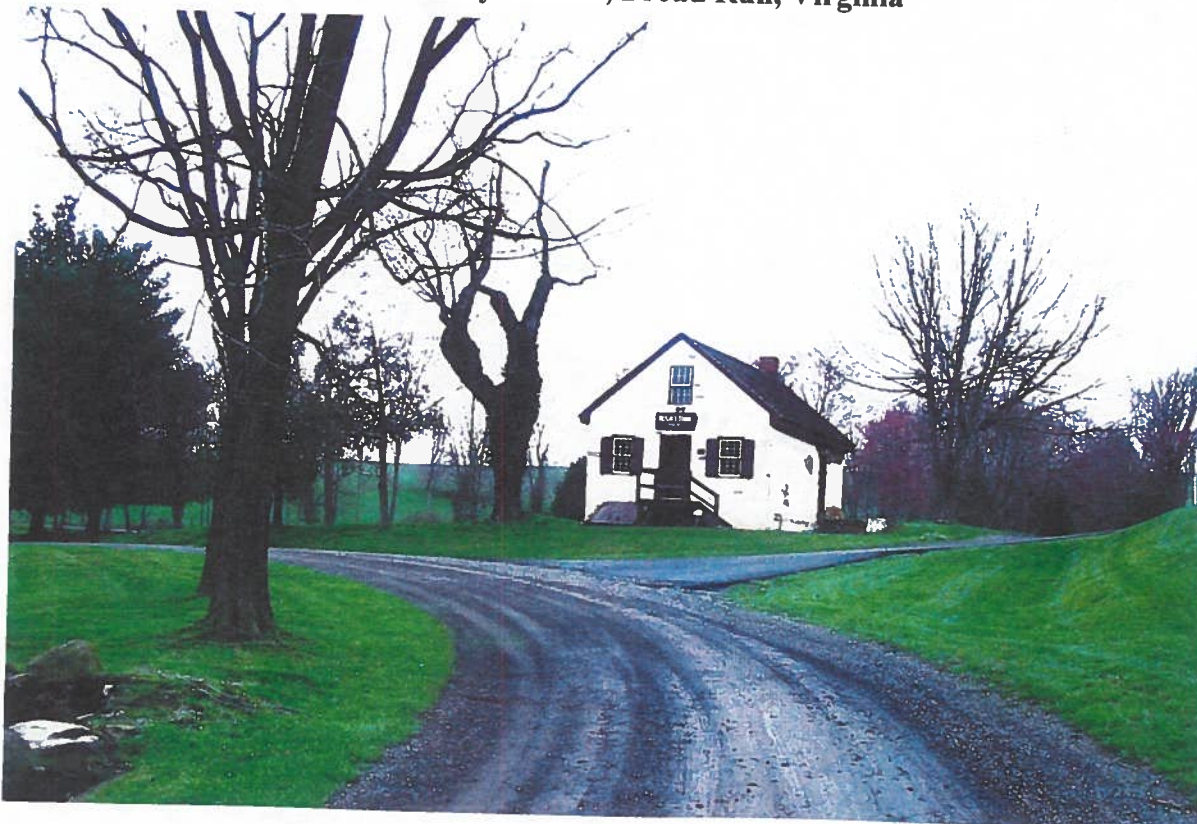

Alton Farm house has been greatly changed over the years and the original structure has been altered even though some of the original woodwork remains. Part of the house is log: 2 rooms, now the kitchen and the dining room, separated by a log wall and originally 1 1/2-story, now 2-story. The upper half of the south log wall has been eliminated so the closed-in porch communicates with the dining room. What appears to have been a doorway has been made into shelf space. Windows have been altered. A mantel has been added to the fireplace in the log dining room that probably more properly belonged to the frame front part of the house, since both were likely of ca. 1800 origin.

The frame part of the house, center-hall plan and 2 stories with attic, may have undergone a renovation around 1840 but most of the old mantels and doors were kept; floors and staircase appear to be of mid-19th century style.

One slave cabin/out kitchen has survived but there must have been many more as the farm had at least 28 slaves in 1857. A meat house of undetermined age sits nearby. A barn that once belonged to the farm is across Rt. 672 and is a good example of a bank barn - with massive timbers, hand-hewn and mortised and tenoned and pegged together over a stone ground level section.

A spectacular element on the property is the cemetery with at least 50 graves of Smiths, Pootes, Cookrills, Nutts, Huntons, and Hill.

Historical significance (Chain of title; individuals, families, events, etc., associated with the property.)

This was the home of William Rowley Smith who grew up at Mt. Eccentric. Wm. R. Smith, 1781-1857 married Lucy Steptoe Blackwell, 1793-1879, in 1809 and had 19 children. He was a justice of Fauquier County 1810-1852; he commanded a company of cavalry in the War of 1812 and was a colonel in the Fauquier militia in 1815; he was a member of the state legislature for 3 terms.
